Wildflower Meadows in Bovey Tracey and Heathfield

We have in Britain one of the most crowded, modified landscapes in the world. A destructive combination of modern agriculture, new roads, building developments, and climate change is fragmenting the habitats of wildflowers. This in turn is leading to massive reductions in numbers of wildflowers and pushing some species towards extinction. Wildflower meadows have been reduced by 97% since the 1930s and this in turn has huge implication for wildlife and consequently us.

However, not all the news is grim. Many national and local organisations have sprung up over recent years to address this pressing issue, looking to re-establish wildflower meadows in many areas – farmland, verges, local parks, community spaces and even in our own gardens. Bovey Tracey is fortunate to have its own Bovey Parish Wildflower group working hard behind the scenes to do its bit on a local level.

You may have noticed some of the ongoing projects such as the verge-side along Molay-Littry Way; the corner of Bradley Bends and the grass site outside the fire station. Teignbridge District Council has also prepared an area on Battle Road Heathfield. Much thought and work has gone into the preparation, creation and continuing maintenance of these sites. The hope is that over the following years, rather than the previous flat and sterile areas of uninteresting grass, little pockets of rough grass and native wildflowers will re-invigorate the wildlife in these areas.

A National shift in attitudes is reflecting the need for change, as councils report receiving more letters of congratulation for not mowing until flowers have set seed, than complaints about untidy verges. There are numerous benefits to such wildflower projects of any size. Flower-rich grasslands store 500% more carbon than fields of pure grass; Well-being and health benefits such as lowering of blood pressure are well reported when admiring flowers on a regular basis; Plants in a flowering meadow support 1000's of species of invertebrates, as well as attracting birds, bats and other mammals. If that wasn't enough, they can demonstrate to passers-by that we are responding locally to the climate crisis and transforming pockets of the town and locality into beautiful flower meadows for us and the wildlife to enjoy.

Catching up fast, the Riverside Community Centre now has a Manager and Caretaker.

A Facebook page has been created to promote the facilities and work is being undertaken to continually review and improve what is available.

Currently the day rate is starts from ± 12.50 or the room can be booked by the hour at ± 2.50 .
